

New Music Inc is an incubator initiative supporting small-budget, artist-led organizations in Baltimore, Chicago, and New York City through pivotal stages of organizational growth. This hands-on program combines financial investment with skill-building and peer-to-peer learning within a cohort environment that includes leaders who represent a range of music genres, neighborhoods, and backgrounds.

Each city's cohort is facilitated by a local program coordinator who is actively involved in their regional music community. By fostering strategic development and collaborative networks, New Music Inc strengthens the music ecosystems these organizations actively shape.

Administered by New Music USA and powered by SESAC and composer Christophe Beck, with additional sponsorship from Amazon MGM Studios, this pivotal program gives composers at crucial career stages the resources they need to produce compelling, original scores.

Grant support covers composer compensation, musician fees, studio costs, orchestration, recording, mastering, and essential production resources, ensuring that emerging talents can advance professionally and build sustainable careers in film composition.

#### **Mentorship for Emerging Jazz Artists**

Now in its third year, Next Jazz Legacy is a national apprenticeship and mentorship program designed to elevate emerging jazz improvisers. Operated in partnership with the Berklee Institute of Jazz and Gender Justice, funded by the Mellon Foundation, and led by GRAMMY-winning artist and NEA Jazz Master Terri Lyne Carrington, the initiative increases opportunities for musicians who will contribute to a vibrant and inclusive jazz future.

Awardees receive a comprehensive support package including intergenerational mentorship, performance showcases at major jazz festivals, professional networking opportunities, and financial resources for creative and career development—helping secure a more equitable and sustainable future for jazz.



#### **BREAKING BARRIERS**

#### **Advancing Orchestral Opportunities for Early-Career Composers**

For the second consecutive year, New Music USA partnered with Highland Park, IL's Ravinia and the Taki Alsop Conducting Fellowship to offer an orchestral reading opportunity at the Breaking Barriers Festival. Chosen through a call for scores opportunity, the awardees had their works read by musicians from the Chicago Philharmonic and Taki Alsop Conducting Fellows, under the direction of Ravinia Chief Conductor Marin Alsop and Augusta Read Thomas. This partnership creates pathways for meaningful collaboration between emerging composers and conductors, directly addressing systemic inequities in orchestral music.



### Presented by New Music USA

NewMusicBox (NMBx) is New Music USA's national digital platform and online magazine dedicated to the exchange of ideas surrounding new music in all its forms. Founded by the American Music Center in 1999, NMBx has elevated over 7,000 interviews and artist-authored stories, earning multiple ASCAP Deems Taylor/Virgil Thomson awards for outstanding music journalism.

In FY24, following the departure of its longtime editor Frank J. Oteri, NewMusicBox entered a period of transition, exploring how the platform can best evolve and deepen its impact in the changing digital landscape. Simultaneously, we collaborated with Yale University's Oral History of American Music (OHAM), to ensure the long-term scholarly preservation and accessibility of our NMBx archive.




